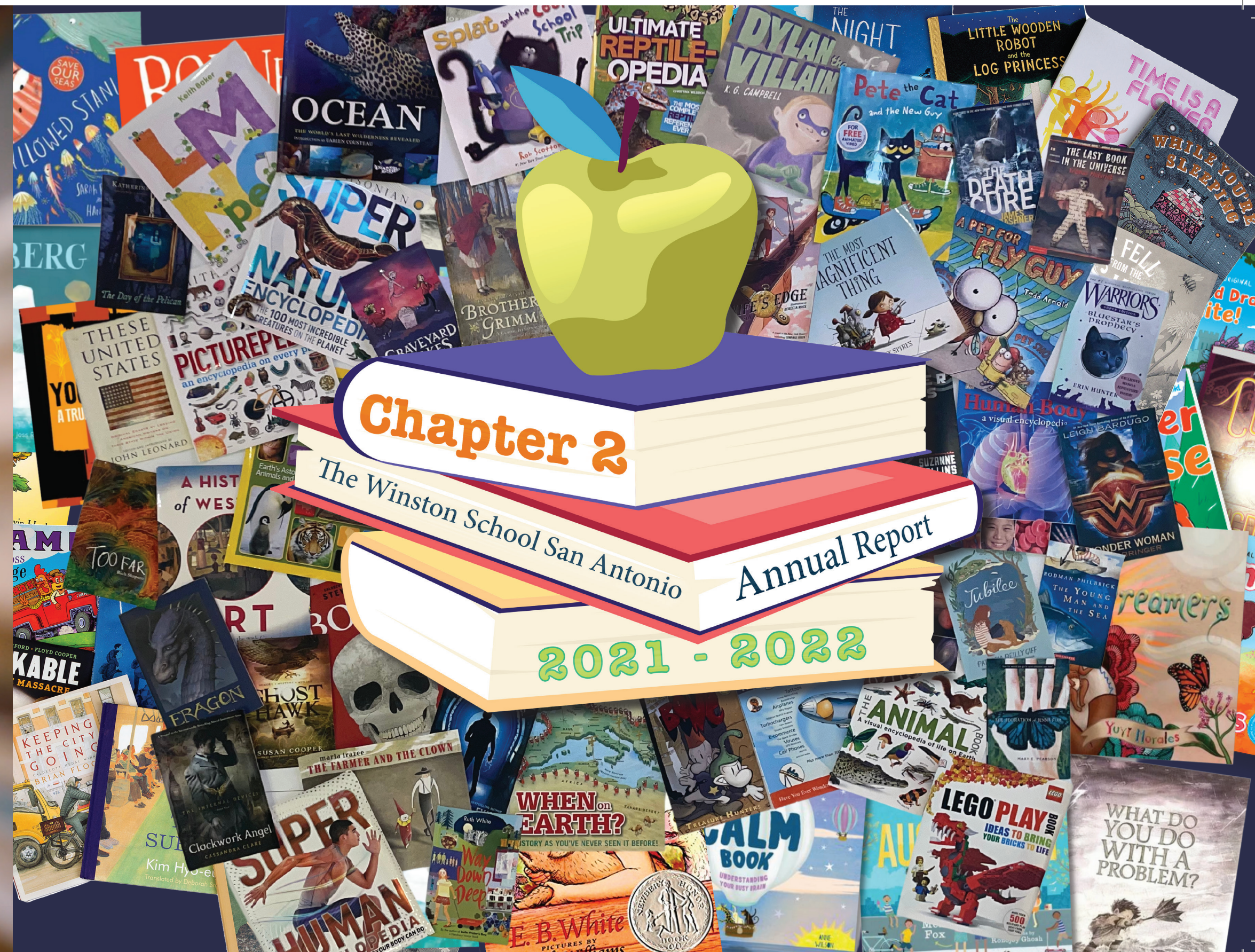

The Dr. Charles J. Karulak Scholarship for 2021-2022 was awarded to Miss Kathryn Young.

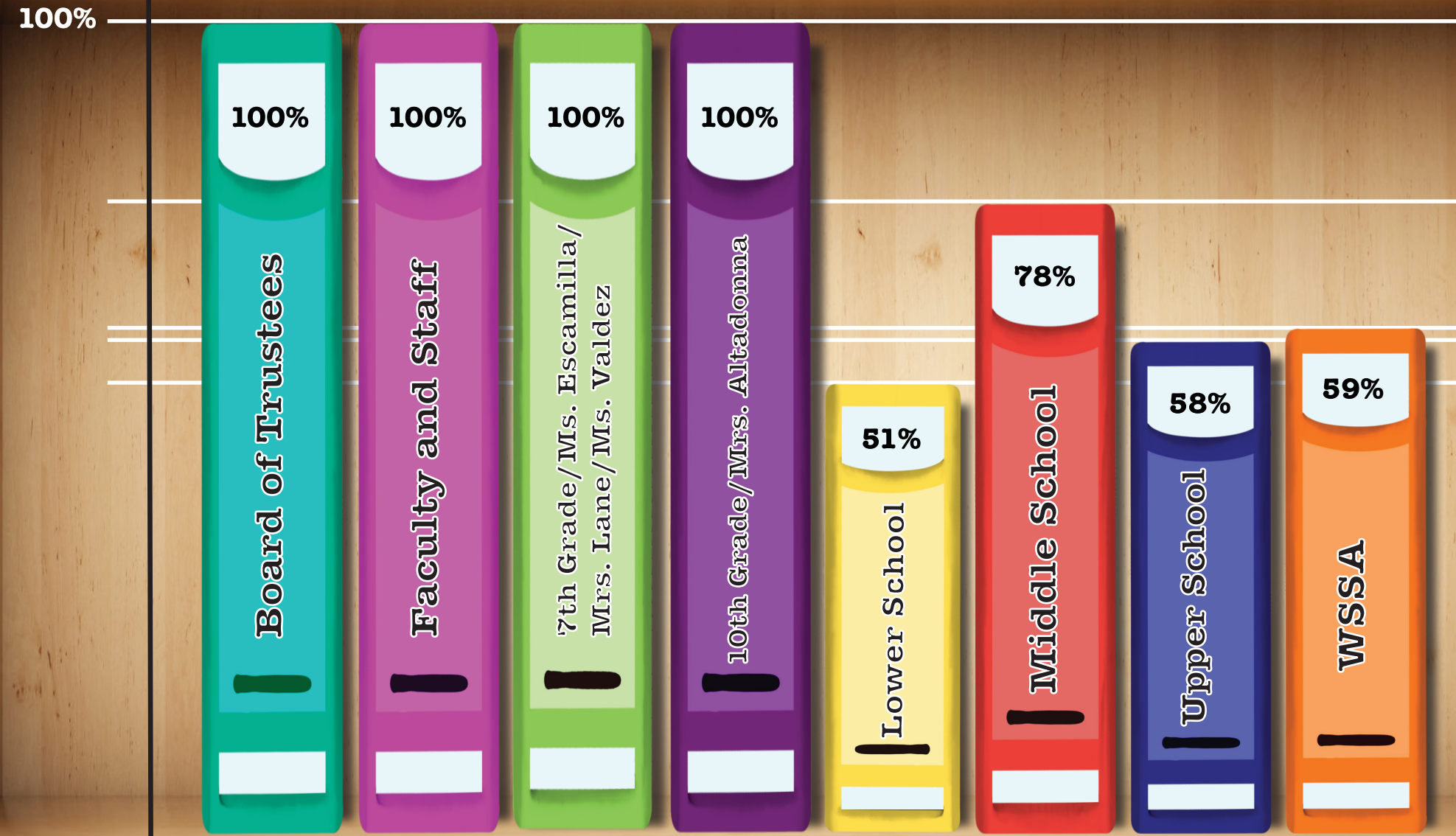
