The Winston School San Antonio (WSSA) Summer Program is designed for students entering grades K – 12, who struggle and need the benefit of remediation for the upcoming school year. We offer courses in the following three categories:

High School Courses for Credit

Credit courses are demanding academically, and the summer schedule is rigorous. Credit will not be awarded to students who miss more than one class. Upon successful completion of a high school summer course, a grade report will be mailed home along with a transcript.

Withdrawals

If a student withdraws from a credit course after the start of summer school on Monday, June 3^{rd} , the withdrawal, and withdrawal grade will be noted on the student's permanent record. A withdrawal will require a parent's written authorization.

Extended Day (Aftercare)

Our Extended Day Aftercare will be held in the Dining Hall from 3:00 to 6:00 pm daily. Students must be picked up on time. Parents arriving after 6:00 pm will be charged \$15 for every 10 minutes that you are late. The fee for Extended Day is \$175 per week. Registration is required.

Summer at Winston

Our Summer Program features WSSA's unique instructional approach, small class sizes, close monitoring of student progress, and a concentration on the students' strengths. Summer at Winston is open to Winston and non-Winston students with average to above average intelligence who may or may not have a learning difference. A learning difference may include ADHD, Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, and Dyscalculia.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Reading, Phonics and Spelling (\$450)

Grades K - 4th Times: 8:00 to 10:00 am

Reading and writing concepts are taught at each level through small-group instruction, phonics-based, and multi-sensory techniques. Instructors use Orton-Gillingham methods for reading fluency and spelling.

Dyslexia Intervention (\$450)

Grades K - 8th Times: 8:00 to 10:00 am

This intervention class is for students who have a reading disability or are below a grade level or more in reading class during the academic school year. This program is designed to provide strategies to develop and build upon skills in the core areas of phonemic awareness, decoding, and encoding. *Students will be grouped by grade level.*

Math Foundations (\$450)

Grades K - 8th Times: 10:30 am to 12:00 pm

Grade level math concepts are taught at each level through small group instruction, the use of technology, textbooks, games, and projects. Tactile manipulatives are used to increase conceptual understanding and connect ideas through hands-on learning.

Students will be grouped by grade level.

Math Intervention (\$450)

Grades K - 8th Times: 10:30 am to 12:00 pm

The math intervention program uses explicit and targeted instruction and practice of essential concepts. This program is designed for students who are not yet performing at grade level. *Students will be grouped by grade level.*

Comprehension & Writing (\$450)

Grades 5th - 8th Times: 10:30 am to 12:00 pm

This course will engage comprehension strategies for passage, short-story, and novel reading. Students will work on fundamentals of writing at each level (sentence structure, paragraph development, and message writing). Keyboarding and Speech-to-Text technology are available for all students. *Students will be grouped by grade level.*

ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

Creative Writing (\$650)	
Grades K - 4 th	Times: 12:30 to 3:30 pm

In this course, young students will build their reading and writing skills by studying the works of picture book masters. Each day in class, students begin by reading and discussing a picture book addressing an advanced Language Arts topic. Followed by trying their hand at writing with a unique assignment based on the day's topic. In the final days of this course, students will have the chance to apply what they have learned as they write and illustrate a picture book of their very own.

2D & 3D Art (\$650)	
Grades K - 6 th	Times: 12:30 to 3:00 pm
Grades 7 th - 12 th	Time: 9:00 - 11:30am

Students will investigate a wide range of media and techniques as they engage in drawing, painting, and clay modeling. *Students will be grouped by grade level.*

STEM Innovation (\$650)	
Grades K - 6 th	Times: 12:30 to 3:00 pm
Grades 7 th - 12 th	Times: 9:00 - 11:30 am

This course is intended to integrate the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics through project-based learning and design thinking. Students will use background knowledge, make cross-content connections, build confidence, and engage in collaboration and creativity to solve problems. *Students will be grouped by grade level.*

Theater Arts (\$650)	
Grades K - 12 th	Times: 12:30 to 3:00 pm
Grades 7 th - 12 th	Time: 9:00 - 11:30 am

Students will investigate a wide range of media and techniques as they engage in drawing, painting, and clay modeling. Students will be grouped by grade level.

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Creative Writing (\$650)	
Grades 5 th - 6 th	Times: 12:30 to 3:00 pm
Grades 7th -12th	Times: 9:00 - 11:30 am

This summer writing program offers students interested in different types of writing to immerse themselves in the field. This program ranges from creative writing to playwriting, to poetry, and everything in between.

Executive Function Junction (\$650)	
Grades 5 th – 6 th	Times: 12:30 to 3:00 pm
Grades 7th - 12th	Times: 9:00 – 11:30 am

Executive Function coaching provides a low-stress environment for students to work on their EF skills including organization, time management, task initiation, efficient studying habits, and more.

Conversational Spanish (\$650)	
Grades 7th - 12th	Times: 9:00 to 11:00 am

This course is an introduction to the study of the Spanish language with instruction structured to promote the development of speaking and listening skills for direct application within any setting. Students will focus on the development of vocabulary, pronunciations skills, basis sentence patterns, and an overview of the Latin culture.

Entrepreneurship (\$600)	
Grades 7th - 12th	Times: 12:30 to 3:00 pm

Starting a business is more than just a good idea. Successful entrepreneurs know how to use and apply fundamental business concepts to turn their ideas into thriving businesses. Explore topics such as identifying the best business structure, business functions and operations, finance, business laws, regulations, and more!

E-Sports (\$600)

Grades 7th - 12th Times: 10:00 am to 12:00 pm

This course will investigate the Esports industry by 1) playing, strategizing, and analyzing video games, 2) researching how competitions are organized and run at the professional level, 3) learning about the sport and the history of gaming, and 4) creating content to contribute to the video game community. Whatever type of gamer you are, this course will allow you to problem-solve, communicate with a team, and learn about a new exciting industry all while improving your gaming skills.

Athletics - Strength & Conditioning (\$525)

Grades 7th - 12th Times: 7:00 to 9:00 am

This program is designed to enhance athletic performance and skills while focusing on form, posture, and coordination. Students will also focus on heat acclimation, speed, strength, agility, and conditioning of all sports. Coaches will group by age.

HIGH SCHOOL COURSES FOR CREDIT

High School Course List 0.5 credit (\$825) or 1.0 credit (\$1,625)

Grades 9th - 12th Times: 8:15 am to 12:15 pm

Students can earn up to 1.0 high school credit from core subjects taught throughout the school year. These courses are designed for students who have some previous knowledge of the course material and are best suited for credit recovery or remediation.
